Ordinance No. 10

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR
THE CALLING AND HOLDING OF
A SPECIAL ELECTION TO SUBMIT
TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS
OF THE CITY OF OVERBROOK,
OSAGE COUNTY, KANSAS, THE
PROPOSITION OF LICENSING THE
RETAIL SALE OF ALCOHOLIC
LIQUORS BY THE PACKAGE IN
THE CITY OF OVERBROOK.

WHEREAS, a petition, having placed
at the top of each sheet, the propo-
sition, "Shall the sale of alcoholic
liquors by the package be licensed in
the city of Overbrook, Osage County,
Kansas?" and,

WHEREAS, said petition having
been properly signed by at least For-
ty per cent (40%) of the qualified
electors of the City of Overbrook,
Kansas, voting at the last General
Election. and said petition having
been properly signed and acknowl-
edged and filed with the City Clerk
of said city; and,

WHEREAS, the governing body
having determined that said peti-
tion was sufficient for the purpose
of having said proposition submitted
to all of the qualified electors of
said city:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT OR-
DAINED BY THE GOVERNING
BODY OF THE CITY OF OVER-
BROOK, OSAGE COUNTY, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. That the proposition,
"Shall the sale of alcoholic liquors
by the package be licensed in the
City of Overbrook, Kansas?" shall
be submitted to all qualified electors
of the City of Overbrook, Osage Coun-
ty, Kansas, at a special Election.

SECTION 2. Said Election to be
held on the 27th day of May, 1949,

SECTION 3. The Ballot to be used
in said election shall be substantially
in the following form:

OFFICIAL CITY BALLOT

Voters desiring to vote in favor of
the sale of alcoholic liquors by the
package shall place a cross (X) in
the square opposite the word "Yes",
and those desiring to vote against
the sale of alcoholic liquors by the
package shall place a cross (X) in
the square opposite the word "No".

SECTION 4. All qualified electors
residing in the City of Overbrook
shall be entitled to vote at said
election.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall
take effect and be in full force from
and after its passage, approval and
publication.
