The regular meeting of the Overbrook City Council was held January 12, 1977 at 7:30 in the city building. Council members Stout, Ufford, Jones, Hummel and Duncan were present. Also present were sity attorney, Steve Jones, Judge Larry Coursen, Dale Fox, Bob Brown, Earl Warren, Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Greene, and Bruce Smith.

Minutes of the December 8, 1976 meeting were read and approved.

Stout moved to pay thebills, Hummel seconded the motion.

Deveg moved to pay Bud Coffman \$25 for helping with the water leak at O'Bryhim's store. Duncan seconded the motion. It was voted on and carried. Check was issued and Duncan said he'd deliver it.

The delinquent water bills were presented to the Conneil. Council authorized Dale to cut off the water after the 15th of the month if not paid. Dale said notices of this had already been sent.

Minutes of the January 12, 1977 meeting continued.

Lyan Schoonover has volunteered to keep the fire truck in good shape.

Hummel moved to designate thinks 'Brook Times'' as the official newspaper for 1977. Jones seconded the motion. It was voted ondand carried.

Council authorized Max to order 100 dog tags.

Bob asked Council to decide something on the Criminal Gnd Traffic Codes that attorney "ones has discussed earlier. Hummel moved to adopt the proposed traffic and criminal codes drawn up by officier Brown, including a penalty clause and a cover sheet. Duncan seconded the motion. It was voted on and carried. Bob agreed to write up ordinances in corpect form.

Stout moved to adjourn. It was seconded, voted on and carried.

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council of Overbrook was called to order at 7:30 p.m., Feb. 9, 1977 by Mayor Gerald Coffman.

Acting clerk Davy Jones called roll and all Councilmen present.

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Minutes of January meeting read and approved as read, Mr. Charles Hammer, Mrs. Barbara Williams, Laura Lacey, and Ada Vincent, were present as a committee to ask the Council their intentions in enforcing the Dog Leash Law. They were assured that the Leash Law was being revised and would be a part of The Model Criminal Code for the City of Overbrook.

Mr. Here Wigt from Lawrence, Ks. was present and gave the Council some facts and figures about contracting water from Lawrence, when the Clinton Dam is full. The Council indicated an interest in following up on this information. Gordon Hummel will contact Rural Water district, and do further research before the next meeting.

Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Green were present, and asked the Council about a second year contract for trash pickup. The Council had no objections, details to be worked out in May.

Davy indicated that the swimming pool Internal Revenue Quartley reports have not been filed since 1975. Discussion followed, no decision.

The following Bills were presented for payment ...

Stout made motion to pay the bills, seconded by Duncan. Passed unammious.

Barbara William's letter of resignation was read. Hummel made motion to accept the resignation. Stout seconded, Passed unanniously.

The problem of keeping the Post Office open later was discussed, no decision.

Mayor Coffman signed papers making the Overbrook City Council a sponsor of the local Pride Program.

The Council authorized Officer Brown to set up a meeting with the City Council and a Grant Coordinator.

The Swimming Pool situation discussed, no decision.

Water Bills discussed, some progress being made in collecting overdue bills.

The Council instructed Dale that  $\frac{d\phi}{f}\frac{d\phi}{f}\frac{d\phi}{f}$  notice of non-payment be sent if an individual had one back bill plus the current bill. No payment in thirty days, shut off water.

Duncan made motion to rescind last months motion to make the Brook Times the official paper, and make the Citizen the official paper. This change must be made due to a recent change in the State Law. Seconded by Jones...Unanmious vote.

Motion to adjourn by Duncan, Seconded by Jones.

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#### THE REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING OF OV REROOK CITY COUNCIL Mar. 9, 1977

The regular meeting of the Overbrook City Council was called to order by Mayor Coffman at 7:30 P.M. on Mar. 9, 1977 in the City building. Roll call was answered by council members Ufford, JonesHUmmel, Stout, and Duncan. Also Present were Mr. & Mrs. Kenneth Greene, Earl Warren, Bob Brown and Dale Fox. Bruce Hackett arrived later during the meeting. M inutes of the Feb. 9, meeting were read and approved.

Mayor Coffman read a letter from Dep. James Gardner, Osage County Co-ordinator for Civil Defense telling about the seminar on Tornado Spotting that is to be held at 7:30 P.M. on 3-15-77 at the Army Reserve Center in Osage City. He asked for a good representation from Overbrook, Bob Brown, Dale Fox and perhaps others will attend.

A water report form-as requested by letter- will be sent in soon. Hummel, Jones, Ufford, & Mayor Coffman attended a meeting at Worden for a discussion on the availability of water from Clinton Reservoir in cooperation with the City of Lawrence and Douglas County Water Dist.#5. A motion was made by Calvin Ufford that the Council file and application with the Water Resources Board, asking for an allotment of 150,000 gal. per day of water from theClinton Reservoir when it is available. The motion was seconded by Hummel and carried unanimously.

A notice is to be put in the local paper stating that Greene Sanitation will make a special bulk pick-up in Overbrook on Saturday Mar. 19, 1977 starting at 7:00 A. M . and following the regular pickup route.

The contract with Greene's is renewable for signing in June. A fee of 50% per ton for dumping will be absorbed by Greene until June, when an adjustment will be made on the new contract to be signed then.

The point was made taht a rural resident has been bringing trash to town and adding it to her employer's trash for pickup. Dale will notify her to either stop the practice or pay a separate pickup fee for the service.

Bruce Hackett told the group that Kenneth Finlay will start work Friday Mar. 🏦 on streets in the Meadows addition: Devon St will be blacktopped where the ho uses are in now, with Surrey Lane and 2nd. St. to be graded and prepared, but black top not applied until houses are located there. At that time he will return and have those streets blacktopped. He asked that the council have this work inspected as it is being done. With the council's approval Calvin Ufford agreed to do this inspection.

After some discussion and the reading of ordinances pertaining to the possession and control of dogs within the city limits, a motion was made by Davey Jones to provide the necessary equipment for pickup and handling of all dogs loose in the city. The motion was seconded By Hummel and carried unanimously. A notice is to be put in the paper that all dogs running at large will be picked up and impounded. Owners will be notified only if the dog is wearing a City, license tag. To retrieve the dog the owner must pay \$5.00 plus theregular fee charged by the Franklin County Humane Society in Ottawa. 'This City ordinance goes into effect April 1, and will be strictly enforced.

Nadìne Cordts & Davey Jones were at Baker & Ottawa Univ. in regard To personnel for operation of the swimming pool this summer. There was discussion on the repairs needed on the pool before next season.

Office Brown pointed out that posting is necessary at private parking areas in the business district and public parks, Granting pla police authority to patrol these areas. He indicated that owners were agreeable to this, as was the council.

A motion for a \$25.00 per month raise for both Brown and Fox was made by Bob Duncan and seconded by Calvin Ufford. It Earried by a simp le majority. A motion to increase the montaly pay of the treasurer and the clerk to \$25.00 each was made by Stout, Seconded by Duncan and earried unanimously.

Dale Fox reported all notices on delinquent water bills were sent out, both for 2month and 3 month unpaid bills.

Motion for adjournment was made by Ufford, seconded and Earried at 🧠 11:00 P. M.

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On May 11, 1977 the Overbrook City Council was called to order in the City Hall for their regular monthly meeting by Mayor Calvin Ufford at 7:30 P M. The roll, as called by the clerk, was answered by council members Davey Jones, Bruce Cole, Gordon Hummel, and Lynn Schoonover. Also present were the treasurer Max Friesen and clerk Lorene Harth , Dale Fox, Bob Brown, Mr. & Mrs. Kenneth Greene and Bruce Smith. Mr. Bob Harmon and Don Hylton were present to represent the Farmer's Alliance Insurance Company soon after roll call. Minutes of thelast meeting were approved as written. Bills were discussed briefly then approved as listed.

Bob Harmon and Don Hylton reviewed the Liability Insurance which their company carries for the City of Overbrook and answered several questions for the council members. They left immediately after the questions ended. Dennis Norton spoke for the Atheletic Asso. concerning a location for an additional ball field. No other site seems available so efforts will be continued to work out satisfactory arrangements with the Overbrook Osage County Fair Asso. and the City to find room in the park area for a second ballfield.

Mr. Greene said his za insurance company- the Lorton Ins. Co. -will send the City a copy of his coverage soon.

Lynn Schoonover presented a petition signed by a number of residents in the area, requesting a change in house numbers in the Frieruble addition of Overbrook. G ordon Hummel made a motion that the houses be numbered in the one hundred(100) series corresponding to the lot numbers in 9th. St. Court and Oak Court. The motion was seconded and carried unamimously.

The Council approved the agreement made by Nadine Cordts as to salary for the third swimming pool employee, and noted that each of the three must make her wwn application for approval at C E T A in Ottawa.

The question as to whether Frieruble Addition #2 can be taken into the City and - at their own expense- connect to the City water system without hooking on to the sewer system, will be investigated further. City ordinance may not permit this action.

Mr. Greene reported damage done to the street in Meadows addition while making a trash pickup at the Apartment complex. The question arose as to whether the streets areCity responsibility or still Mr. Hackett's. After discussion it was agreed that Greene will check with his lawyer and Calvin will also inquire as to the proper steps to secure correction the street problem in that area.

The price on down-spouting for the City water tower was reported by Lynn on both plastic and aluminum material.

Bob Brown and Dale Fox each signed the oath of office as given them by the clerk. Election of officers for the council followed . Davey made the motion to follow the custom of electing for council chairman the member receiving the greatest number of votes at the time they were elected to the council, this being Dr. Bruce Cole. Motion was seconded and carried unanimously. Mayor Ufford advised that other city personnel would retain their present positions, Friesen as Treasurer, Brown as Marshall, Dale Fox as City maintenance man and fire chief, Harth as clerk. Nadine Cordts is to be Recreation Chairperson, and Gordon Hummel is water service Chairman.

An ordinance naming the Citizen as the official city paper is to be published. Hamm's Construction Co. has expressed interest in doing the street repair again. A contract was made with the Mayor about the possibility of distributing free bacon in the City- no committment was made however.

Dog tags are due June 30, 1977; the fee after that wate will be increased. A few dogs arestill at large sometimes.

The Council agreed to let Clemen Greene Canteen service provide candy etc. to the swimming pool again this year.

There was discussion of the possibility of improving the condition of the extra room at the city hall and making better use of it. The Library Board is to be contacted on the subject to see if they might share the cost as well as the use of the room. The "New U" E H U was given permission to use the city hall on June 7, 1977. Work on the new budget will begin soon; Lynn will go with Max to Lyndon for the preliminary planning session for all municipalities.

A motion to raise sanitation collection fees to \$2.25 beginning with the July billing was made by Hummel, seconded and carried by a vote of 3-1.

Tree problems and alleyways were discussed, also public nuisance situations souch as John Schoenick home, old cars, and the brush in the park. Mayor Ufford asked Brown to approach Schoenick about his plans for correcting the condition of his front yard.

A tool box for Dale's truck was agreed to without vote. Signs deemed by Marshall Brown to be necessary around the city will be settled at the next meeting. Streets, especially north Maple, were considered. Coordinating with the County on repair work will be taken up by the Mayor with the County people. Water underneath the surface is presumed to be the trouble.

Gordon Hummel will try to have a water engineer at the Council meeting next month to discuss the City water situation.

Hummel's motion to reject all applications so far received for police officer and open the position for new bids was eventually withdrawn. Davey made a motion to table the decission on the applicants until the p ending report was received on David Graham from Wellington. T his motion died from lack of a majority vote. Davey's motion to table the decision to an adjourned meeting was seconded, carried by a majority, but was followed by a motion made by B ruce to adjourn the meeting to Tue. May 17, 1977 at 7:30, at which time a decision on the choice of a new police officer will be made. This motion was seconded and carried, thus adjourning the regular meeting at 11:55 P. M.

The adjourned meeting of the City Council was called to order by ayor Ufford at the city hall at 7:30 on May 17, 1977. All council member ere present. The matter of a decision on hiring a new police officer we mmegiately taken up. A motion by Bruce Cole was stated thus: "Taking a things into consideration I move that the City hire Steven Brown as poliofficer". It was seconded by Lynn Schoonover. After some discussion as reading of conditions of employment the vote was, taken, and the motion warried unanimously with five 'yes'votes . He is start as soon as possib The point was made that there is apparently enough money on hand in

the swimming pool fund to start the summer season.

Hummel questioned whether there should be a lease with the Mason's improving the rest rooms but no decision to do so was made.

Mayor Ufford advised the group that Marilyn Anderson was not Qualif by O E T A for the job of City Clerk, at least for the present time.

Probation period and fringe benefits for the new police officer will be included in his contract .

Liability Insurance for council members  $\phi$  and funding for it by a one mill levy was reviewed. Lynn made a motion to take out P O L insura as soon as possible. The motion was seconded and carried by a vote of yes-4 and no-0

The Council resolved to invite the officers of the Overbrook Osage County Fair Asso. to the next council meeting to discuss the ball field problem further.

The motion for adjournment was made by Davey Jones and carried at 10:05 P M

#### RAGULAR MEETING OF THE OVERBROOK CITY COUNCIL JUNE 8, 1977

Mayor Calvin Ufford called the regular monthly council meeting to order at 7:30 on June 8, 1977. Roll call was answered by Bruce Cole, Nadine Cordts, Gordon Hummel, Davena Jones, and Lynn Schoonover. Others present were Mr. & Mrs. Kenneth Greene, Dale Fox, Steven Brown, and Bruce Smith. Minutes of the last regular meeting were corrected, then approved.

Bills were descussed, and on motion made by Gordon Hummell, duly seconded, and passed unanimously, were ordered paid.

Kenneth Green called attention to the household bulk trash pickup to be made in Overbrook on Sat. 6-18-77, starting promptly at 7:00 A M, and following the regular route.

Nadine Cordts reported that an aluminum diving doard had been ordered for the swimming pool at a cost of \$393.00 "ater in the pool was reported in good condition.

Bruce Smith reported on the Pride program and asked for City approval for Pride signs to be put up on City property. General areement was given and they will be placed as soon as information is gathered as to the locations.

The possibility was discussed of placing the proposed R etirement Housing Project under City Housing Authority. Tax and land Acquisition benefits would be realized under this plan. Bruce Cole reported that surveys so far show only 5 persons have singed as ready to move into retirement housing now; 10-12 are needed. Many are interested, however. There was discussion of the advantages and the obligations upon the City if they lend their backing to the procedure of building the homes.

Three engineers arrived at the meeting at this time. They were:

Charles Stienbacher and Stewart Eutchison, professional engineers, and Ronald Skinner, Engineering Technician, all of the firm of Evans, Bierley, and Hutchison. They presented some facts and charts concerning our possible agreement for a future water supply with the Douglas County Rural water Dist. #5, and the City of Lawrence.

Bob Brown came in at this time- 8:30 P M. r. Stienbacher stressed that we should get our application in to the water Resources Board for water as soon as possible. His suggestion was for storage at Clinton and processing of water by the City of Lawrence for our use. Discussion followed on the cost of securing water under this plang, and on other possible sources of water for future use. The topic was tables for more thought and future action.

Bob Brown asked permission for the Jaycee's to have fireworks and a dance on July4, '779 or actually Junday. Nadine Cordts made the motion to allow the dance and other entertainment at Heberling Hall, it was seconded and carried unanimously. The Jaycee's also want to use the fire equipment to wash and clean, the paint yellow lines on main street, and cross walks at the Hi-Way. They need to get the work done soon and will need about 20 gal. of paint. The motion as made by Davey Jones was to allow the Jaycee's to go ahead with the p roject to wash, paint street lines, parking stalls, and cross walk at the Hiway, and for the City to pay for the paint. Motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

Bob Brown reported that three Walkie-Talkies were allowed from a State grant, with the City's share being 5% of the cost. It seemed agreeable to the council to settle for that much equipment at this time.

The sever situation north of town is to be looked in to soon. Kathleen Rose was approved as a member of the Library Board.

Signs for traffic use may cost around \$300.00 as per the list presented by Bob. Motion by Gordon Hummel to purchase/egally approved signs that are needed according to Bob's list was duly seconded and carried unanimously.

In order to obtain the 2 mill tax levy in the new budget the necessary tion must be taken immediately. The law is effective as of 7-1-77.

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Mayor Calvin Ufford opened the meeting with the statement that the positions under consideration were City Marshall, Asst. Marshall or policeman, and City Maintainance personnell. Fringe benefits for all positions were listed by the Mayor, including a probation period of six months for new employees, maintainance work-week of 40 hours, and police work-week of 48 hours, and Blue Cross and Blue Shield Insurance. Salary Schedules with regulated pay raises on an annual basis were also considered.

Gordon Hummel left the meeting at approximately 11:15 P M. After much discussion a motion made by L ynn Schoonover to pay the full amount of the Blue Cross & Blue Shield Insurance for each employee, either single or family membership as the employee desires, was seconded by Bruce C le and carried by a unanimous vote of the four members present. The executive meeting was adjourned at 11:40 P M.

On motion by Gordon Hummel, which was duly seconded and carried unanimously, it was :

Resolved: That the two mill tax levy available for Law Enforcement be enacted: and

Resolved further: That a one mill tax levy allowable for Public Official Liability Insurance also be enacted.

The location of several dead trees in the City was noted and discussed. Hummel made the motion to ask for bids for removal of these trees as listed The motion was seconded and carried without dissent. by Dale A motion was made by Bruce Cole and seconded by Nadine Cordts thatjustified by the need for privacy in establishing and employment policy, the open council meeting be recessed into executive session in the Library for discussion of daties, responsibilities and salary of city employee's,

and that the open meeting be resumed in the same location as soon as possible. The motion carried unanimously and council members retired to the Library.

The executive session lasted until 11:40 P M , with G. Hummel leaving the meeting at 11:15.

The council reconvened in open meeting in the City Hall at 11:40 P M. Mayor Ufford read the motion as passed in the executive meeting and reviewed it briefly with the three employees.

Kenneth Greens's request to change pickup time to Thursday aftermoon ocal businesses was granted. The rabies clinic was deemed successful. fo:

Virgil Allen requested permission to put up a fence down the alley back of his house, with no liability against utility companies if they find it necessary to damage the fence in providing service to their customers. Permission was granted.

Hamm's Constr. are to check the streets for repairs at 9:00 A M on Tue. June 14, 1977. The possibility of having the Army Band for concert on 8-17-'77 was 0 K'd. An invitation to take part in the Baldwin Maple Leaf Parade was accepted, with Pres. of the Council Dr. Bruce Cole to ride in the parade on Sat. 10-15-'77.

Unemployment Insurance on all employees, effective 1-1-178 is mandatory for the City. The subject of Air conditioning in the police car was settled by a motion by Lynn Schoonover to put in the air in the Car. The motion was duly seconded and carried by the unanimous vote of the four members present.

Darrell Leonard is to be asked to do service work on lift pumps as needed. Lynn Schoonover's motion to donate \$50.00 to the Jaycee's for fireworks for July 4 was seconded and carried without dissent.

Nadine Cordts asked if the road, sewer, and water services were all avail-able on Market St. South of the Clark Coursen property. These are to be varified.

Davey's motion for adjournment was seconded and carried at 12:20 A M .

Sity Clerk

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Mayor Calvin Ufford called the meeting to order in the City Hall at 7:30 P M in regular monthly session. Three council members were present as per roll call by the clerk. Bob Brown, Steve Brown, and Mr. & Mrs. Inneth Greene were also present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as presented. Dale Fox and Bruce Smith arrived at 7:35 P M

The bills were reviewed, discussed, and on motion by Gordon Hummel and seconded, were unanimously approved for payment.

Larry Otten entered the room and remained for the session.

Tree removal bids were called for, with only one bid received, that being from the Jaycee's for the removal of fourteen trees at a cost of \$1,200.00. Gordon H ummel's motion to accept the Jaycee's bid for the trees' removal was seconded and carried by unanimous vote.

Mr. Kramer of Kramer & Associates was not able to be present. Gordon reported that the Kramer firm would do a study on updating the wa ter chlorination system for \$700.00. After discussion a motion to have Kramer and Associates do the study for supplimental chlorination system was made by Davey Jones and seconded by N adine Cordts. It carried by unanimous yes vote of the three members present.

The swimming pool was reported working well, but still some glass found in the pool after the weekends. New signs and cable are being installed to help prevent such problems.

Dale reported Kevin Jones was doing very well.

The Jaycee's plan to do the street cleanup and painting this week-end if weather is suitable. (This was later postponed to wait on possible street repairs.)

The creation of a City Housing Authority was mentioned and disussed, but was set aside for later on the agenda.

The Army Band will play a concert on Aug. 3, '77 at the Middle School.

A motion was made by Nadine Cordts to contract with Darrel Leonard to look after maintenance work on both pump or lift stations for a fee of \$50.00 per month, based on an estimated 10 hrs. work. The motion was seconded and carried by all three votes being yes.

The Bid received from Hamm's Const. Co. for street repair was \$10,350.00 excluding main (Maple) street. Black Top Construction Co.'s bid for the same side streets repair was for \$6,345.00. Motion made by Gordon Hummel to accept the Bid from Black Top Co. for repair listed, and to negotiate with them for other repair work on Maple between 5th and 6th streets, and between Market and 4th was seconded and carried unanimously.

The annual proposed budget for the City was explained by Max Friesen. A motion by Davey to accept the budget as presented was properly seconded, and carried by unanimous vote.

The resolution creating a City Houseing Authority was introduced by Gordon Hummel, read in full, and it's adoption was moved. After being seconded by Nadine Cordts it carried unanimously: thus the resolution creating the City Housing Authority was adopted in full.

A motion was made by Nadine to have the city attorney draw up an ordinance creating a planning commission for the purpose of Zoning/ The motion was seconded by Davey Jones and carried unanimously by three yes votes.

A full time clerk position for the city was discussed. The council agreed to a twenty (20) hr work week- 8:00 to 12:00 A M - for five (5) days each week, starting at the minimum wage of \$2.30 per hour. Annual vacation rate of  $\frac{1}{2}$  day per month seemed agreeable to all present. An advertisent was to be put in both local papers, listing typing and bookkeeping experience preferred gualifications.

Conditions of employment were discussed at length between the council and both Bob and Dale, with some revisions **ax** seen to be needed. The schedule of police hours being worked by each man can be verified thru Mayor Ufford if needed.

Dale fox will be on vacation next week: July 18-24.

Regular meeting of the Overbrook City Council July 13, 1977

Bob Brown will be on the fire phone while Dale is on vacation; Dale will see to getting it arrainged.

Council members agreed to pay the basic phone bill for Steve Brown the same as is being done for Dale and Bob. \$15.40 will be reimbursed to him for July, in addition to next month's bill.

Motion for adjournment was made by Davey, seconded and carried at 11:55 P M

The regular meeting of the council was called to order by Mayor Calvin Ufford at 7:30 on 3-10-77 at the city hall. Roll call was answered by four council members: Bruce Cole, Nadine Cordts, Gordon Hummel, and Lynn Schoonover. Davey Jones came in a few minutes later.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were approved as written. Bills were discussed , including the cost of lights at the ball field,

and the Fair Board's responsibility, if any, to pay that expense. Mation to pay the bills was made by Gordon, seconded by Lynn, and carried unanimously. Joe Reid arrived and was introduced by Max as representative for the

Hartford Insurance Co. Mr. Reid explained the insurance their companycarries for the City., which is fire and extended coverage on buildings, water tower, wells, pump houses, three pumps and lift stations, as well as bonds and volunteer fire department coverage. Several pertinent questions wereasked, a nd answered by Mr. Reid or Max. The suggestion was made to have Max get the proper rate and amount of cost to cover both water towers with the same amount of insurance. Mr. Reid and Dale went to imspect Heberling Hall.

Mr. Kramer of the firm of Kramer & Associates, Engineers, entered and brought with him a contract for the water supply study that had been discussed at the last meeting. He read the contract to the council and listed the cost at \$700.00, payable upon delivery of the report to the City. A motion was made by Gordon Hummel to enter into this agreement with Kramer and Associates for the study as outlined in the contract. The motion was seconded by Bruce Cole and carried unanimously.

A trash complaintfrom a local citizen was presented by Ken Greene: it seems some trash was not out on time for the morning pickup as per schedule. He had to return to Overbrook in the late aftermoon and pickup the person's trash. The trash behind the City Hall will be gathered up by Kevin Jones in time for Thur. aftermoon's business pickup.

Ordinance #93 as written by Steve Jones for the creation of a planning commission for Zoning purposes was read and discussed. A motion by Nadine to accept the Ordinance as written was 2m seconded by Davey and carried without dissention. The second ordinance creating a Board of Appeals for moning complaints was tabled for later consideration.

Letters from Steve Jones pertaining th the opening of Market street one block farther west were read by Davey. Considerable discussion followed, before a motion was made by Davey that the City open the street at city expense and bring it up to specifications for opening of any city street, in accordance with precedent as established by the City in past years. The motion was seconded by Lynn Schoonover and carried by a vote of 4 yes and 1 no, with Gordon Hummel dissenting.

Application s for City Clerk were reviewed. Laws, as read by Nadine -require that the city clerk be a qualified electors of the city. This eliminated all three applicants as received so far. An advertisement will be run againe in the Citizen and Brook Times for more applicants.

The requirement for secondary treatment of sewage was mentioned but tables for later action.

Signs at private parking lots restricting their use at night are causing hard feelings and B. E. O'Bryhim has taken his down.

The problem of weekend disturbances was discussed, stressing lack of enforcement by local officers. The effectiveness of ourphlice officers was agreed to be pretty low.

A suggestion to hold a special meeting to talk with the police officers about this lack of satisfactory performance of duty was generally agreed to.

A Committee of three namely Nadine Cordts, Davey Jones, and Dr. Bruce Cole, was appointed to thy to provide names of prospective police officers.

Black Top Construction Co's bid to repair 300 feet on north Maple st. at a cost of \$4,500.00 was mentioned, but they have not been able to begin the work as yet. County Commissioner Snell said the County will pay for road work as far as the railroad tracks and will patch to #56 Highway, with the City to pay for sealing this same road.

The bill of 350.00 for feed and keep for the horse being kept at the Overbrook Sale Barn, was not deemed to be the responsibility of the City.

Max reported that Frank Schirmer asked for a verbal indication that the City would accept a one acre addition on the north edge of the city limits. The water and wewer lines would be connected at Schirmer's own expense. A motion for tenative approval of this agreement on the one acre plot was made by Gordon, seconded by Lynn and carried unanimously.

Removal of trees is to be begun soon by the Jaycees.

The need to line up extra security for the Fair has been brought to the attention of Bob Brown.

A Motion to increase the salary of the Municipal J udge by \$50.00 -As requested by Judge Larry Coursen- was made by Gordon, seconded by Bruce and carried unanimously, to go into effect with September payment of salaries.

Motion to adjourn to a special meeting at 7:30 on Aug. 17, 1977 for the purpose of reviewing and evaluating the performance of their duties by the present police force was made by Lynn, seconded and carried nanimously at 11:10 P M.

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The regular meeting of the Overbrook City Council was called to order by Mayor Ufford at 7:30 P.M. September 14, 1977.

Roll call was answered by all council members also attending were Dale Fox, Steve Brown, Janie Smith, Tom Witts, Fred Marshall and Mr. and Mrs Kenneth Green.

Minutes of the last meeting were approved as written. Nadine Cordts reported the \$18.18 shown on the bills was not the obligation of the pool operators as Bob Brown had signed the ticket which included posts to be used for Police protection for the city.

Dale Fox reported the J.C.'s tree cutting project was almost complete.

Nadine Cordts reported a balance of 61.26 in the **p**ool fund, however as approximately 1500.00 has been paid out of pool collections for the purpose of equipment and repairs, the council felt the pool management was very effective this year.

Hummel moved city bill be paid, Schoonover seconded, motion carried.

The council adknowledged with deepest appreciation the many years of faithful service Don Hoyt has given to the city during his lifetime.

It was reported that the Frank Schrimer residence will not hook on the sewer because the sewer elevation is too high.

Mayor Ufford introduced Tom Witts, Fair Association President and Fred Marshall, a representative from the ball association. Mayor Ufford advised that a lease should be drawn up between the city and the fair assoc. before next season and perhaps the lease could be for 20 years. Witts suggested that the city prepare a lease and present it to the Fair Board for consideration. Both Witts and Marshall gave approval for at least two tennis courts on the north side of the ball diamond. They did not feel it would interfere with parting. It was agreed another ball diamong was needed but Witts advised the fair assoc, has no extra room for a second diamond as they need all they have for a successful fair.

The council felt a request should be made for 1978 CETA funds for the pool operation .

A motion was made by Schoonover to have a hearing for the purpose of dismissal of Robert Brown as a city employee. Hearing date to be September 28, 1977 at 7:30 P.M. in the city building. This date subject to change if City Attorney's schedule interferes Jones seconded, motion carried unamiously. A street address is to be provided for the John Cordts residence now under construction.

Applications for city clerk were reviewed. Motion made by Hummel to hire Frances Carol Carver, hours and wages to be worked out later, effective date of work to be Oct 3. 1977. Cordts sedonded, motion carried

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An error was made in billin the Perrymans for cutting down a tree, the council voted to refund \$90.00 to Mrss Perryman.

A motion made by Hummel to draw up a Charter Ordinance, beginning with the next election, to permit the staggering of terms of the Governing Body. This would eventually mean all positions would be for a four year term, with elections every two years. motion seconded by Jones, Motion carried.

Council voted to send letters to John Schoenik and Mr. and Mrs LaVerl Miller concerning litter in yard and unsightly weed conditions. The authority for these letters is covered in ordinance 91, section 315 and 316.

Councilman Cole is to contact Melvern to get information relative to their new street signs, such as cost, where purchased, etc.

Mayor Ufford reported on progress of street repairs now underway.

Very high water bills for Bruce Thomas was discussed. Dale Fox is to recheck the meter once more although he feels the meter is in good working condition.

Tom Miller, a new Overbrook resident has offered to serve on the Fire department. Fox is to contact him.

The following names were submitted by Mayor Ufford for tentative approval to serve on the Planning Commission. Maurice Fager, Davina Jomes Ernest Rose, Glen Norton, Frank Boyd, Lois Ruble, Melvin Simpson. Hummel moved they be approved, **Cordts** seconded, motion carried.

Mayor Ufford instructed Fox to put up and change any signs needed, with Steve Brown helping. Fox was also instructed to reset posts at pool and winterize pool.

Meeting adjourned to reconvene at Sept. 28, 1977 at 7:30 P.M. at city building.

The adjourned meeting of the council, as per motion made at the regular meeting of 9-14-77 was called to order by Mayor Ufford at 7:30 P.M. Roll was called by the clerk with all council members present. Also present were Bob Sisson, Bruce Smith and Attn. Stephen Jones. The mayor read a copy of the letter delivered to Police Chief Robert Brown on 9-14-77 by Marshall Steve Brown, notifying him of the hearing to be A later phone call frm Bob to Calvin held relative to his dismissal. confirmed receipt of the letter.

The following complaints were listed:

- 1. Bob told the council he did not know the police car was damaged in the chase around Carbondale. A sworn statement signed by service station owner and operator Robert Sisson says that he did know of the damage done, and requested some work done on the vehicle to repair.
- 2. At the council meeting on 8-9-77 Bob Brown was imstructed to be on duty on Friday and Saturday nights for some time in the next few He was off duty three weeks after that on these nights, weeks. disregarding these instructions.
- 3. As pertains to the Carbondale police chase- B ob was not contacted by the shriff's office to assist, nor is there any proof that the Carbondale police asked for his help. This is attested to by written statement from County Sheriff Masters.
- 4. Gasoline Bob charged to the city was put in his personal car, which he claimed to be using for patrol duty. There had been no authorization for his use of his personal car for patrol duty.

Frank Boyd entered the meeting room at this time. Bruce Cole mentioned that there were many other items of conduct that were displeasing, but those mentioned were most recent and obvious. Lynn and Calvin also mentioned knowing of these other items. The notice of hearing, hand delivered to Bob by Steve Brown, was previously written by Stephen Jones on the request of Mayor Ufford several days earlier, just on the possibility that it might be needed. Bob Brown requested by phone that the hearing be postponed until Oct.3,77. When he called back later Calvin reported the council rejected his request. Gordon expressed the feeling that if Bob Brown doesn't pay the gas bill to Sisson, that the city should pay it. The council agreed withthis . A motion to remove Robert Brown as Marshall- Chief of Police of Overbrook, effective as of this date was made by Gordon Hummell. It was seconded by Davey Jones and carried unanimously. Equipment, Clothing, etc. totaling approximately \$389.00 belonging to the city is to be returned by Bob Brown. Attn. Jones suggested the wording for a letter notifying him of the council's decision to remove him from office as of this date, and to return all items issued him by the city. #### REGULAR OVERBROOK CITY COUNCIL MEETING OCTOBER 12, 1977

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Calvin Ufford at 7:30 p.m.

Roll call was answered by all council members. Also attending were Mr. Max Friesen, treasurer, Mr. and Mrs. Ken Greene, sanitation, Mr. Steve Brown, patrolman and Mr. Tom Miller.

The minutes of the September meeting were approved as written. Minutes of the special meeting (Sept. 28) were approved as written.

A list of city bills were presented. Three (3) corrections on salaries were made. The Greene Sanitation bill was entered. Garnishment payment of \$90.88 on Robert Brown was entered. Partial payment for Black Top to be carried until December.

It was moved by Mr. Gordon Hummel and seconded by Mrs. Nadine Cordts that the city bills be paid. Motion carried.

Mrs. Cordts reported that the swimming pool has been winterized.

Mayor Ufford introduced Mr. Tom Miller, of New Hartford, Iowa. Mr. Miller wishes to work as a volunteer deputy and fireman for Overbrook. Also to work as a fill-in patrolman on week-ends, etc. for a small salary. Mr. Miller left the meeting after his request. Some discussion followed, as to our needs for patrolling at night and improvement of the Fire Department.

Mr. Dale Fox entered the meeting at 7:40 p.m.

Mr. Ken Greene reported about the street belonging to Mr. Bruce Hackett and the city. Greene's trash truck is tearing up the street. He would like to stay off of it. The Council instructed Mr. Greene to continue to pick up trash at the Hackett Apartments. Mr. Greene has talked to his lawyer in case Mr. Hackett has a case. Council agreed to notify Mr. Hackett about the condition. Mr. and Mrs. Greene left the meeting after some discussion.

Mr. Bruce Smith entered the meeting at 7:50 p.m.

Mrs. Cordts introduced Mr. Warren Oblinger. Mr. Oblinger is with Oblinger-Smith Corporation of Wichita. He talked to the Council about the recreational needs and opportunities in our city. Also the financial capabilities of the Jones Trust Fund and other funds. Mr. Oblinger told the Council that the time was good for applicat tion of funds. Mrs. Jones reported on the Planning Commission needing a president and a vice president, also a meeting night.

Dr. Cole reported on street signs.

Mr. Bruce Smith left the meeting at 9:10 p.m.

Mayor Ufford read a copy of a new ordinance the Governing Body needs to pass. It amends Section 91-203 of the criminal code, by deleting from it reference of intoxication liquor. It was moved by Mr. Schoonover and seconded by Mrs. Jones to pass the ordinance. Motion carried.

Mayor Ufford reported that letters were sent to Mr. John Schoenik and Mr. and Mrs. LaVerl Miller concerning litter in their yard. They were given thirty (30) days to clean up their property. The property has not been cleaned up as of this Council meeting. It was moved by Dr. Cole to extent the time until October 17 to fulfill their obligations as stated in the letter or the Council will take action. Motion carried.

Council agreed to notify Mr. Bruce Thomas, by letter, to pay his water bill.

A lengthy discussion about the water bills being paid at City Hall took place. Also the electric and gas bills being paid at the same time. No decision was made.

Mr. Hummel reported on narrowing up Market Street's right-a-way. Some discussion followed.

Mr. Hummel reported on dogs running loose. Mayor Ufford stated that a warning should be given followed by a written complaint.

Mr. Hummel reported many streets needed small holes repaired. Mr. Fox reported he needs more patching material. Council moved to get more material and to have Steve Brown help him. Motion carried.

Mrs. Davey Jones left the meeting at 10:40 p.m.

A Petty Cash Fund was set up for the City Clerk, amount \$10.00. Council agreed to bring the application on No. 3 Water Well up to date.
