When:

The program follows the local public schools calendar year, which is usually Mid August through May.

How:

ECKAN:

East Central Economic Opportunity Corporation (ECKAN), a community action agency, has been in existence since 1966, serving low income persons in Anderson, Coffey, Douglas, Franklin, Lyon, Miami, and Osage Counties.

Because parents are the most important influence on a child's development, parents are included in all aspects of the program as direct participants and decision-makers.

Education: The program stresses the development of positive self-esteem and social interaction. Children receive various learning experiences designed to foster intellectual, social and emotional growth.

Health: Emphasis is placed on the importance of the early identification of health problems. Upon entering the program children are screened for medical and dental problems as well as developmental. Parents are assisted with correcting any problems discovered during screenings, and parents are provided with health and safety training.

Nutrition: Healthy and nutritious meals are served in family setting, and the children regularly participate in cooking activities within the classroom. Parents and children are also taught the importance of good nutrition.

Family Service: Family Service Workers work with parents to help identify and solve problems that might adversely affect there children.

Parent Involvement: Parents are provided with opportunities, both inside and outside the classroom, to help with their child's development. In addition, parents play and important roll in the decision making process by serving on the Parents Committee.

Special Needs:

Ten percent of the enrollment slots are set aside for children with special needs. The program fosters and atmosphere of inclusion in its classrooms and cooperates with local schools and health agencies to meet the special needs of children with disabilities.
