Pet Tags are DUE NOW! — The 2016-yr pet license tags should be purchased immediately. Tags are \$5.00 for neutered pets and \$10.00 if not. All pets whether kept indoors or out are required to have a tag. Don't risk a \$60 fine plus \$75 court costs. NOTE: See attached City Ordinance #375 regarding Animal License fees and — READ "Section 3" of the ordinance explaining the AUTO RENEWAL information. If you have an animal with up to date rabies vaccinations that was licensed last year — YOU MAY RECEIVE A 2016 LICENSE AUTOMATICALLY THAT WILL BE CHARGED TO YOUR UTILITY BILLING ACCOUNT! Please take time to read the attached information!

Overbrook Public Library "Privacy & Security" — we are all aware of the emphases companies and businesses are required to put on the protection of customer privacy and security of business records. Libraries are also required to adhere to similar guidelines. With that, our Overbrook Public Library has implemented policies protecting patron information and records. When you visit our Library, you will notice new "STOP" signs at both ends of the business desk directing patrons and all Library visitors to KEEP OUT of employee areas behind the business desk and in Library offices and storage areas. City News . . .

\*Annual Incremental Increase in Water/Sewer Rates – per Ordinances # 363 & 364 (section 4 on each), each calendar year through 2017, City water/sewer rates are adjusted incrementally at a 1% rate. KDHE standards require the City maintain a certain margin between actual cost of operation and income from the Utilities. This change will be seen on the utility bill you receive February 2016.

\*Overbrook Police Department: Winter typically means driving in snow and ice. Be prepared by keeping the gas tank full so if you get stranded you can run the engine to keep warm. However, if you're stuck in the snow, be sure the car's exhaust pipe is not obstructed causing carbon monoxide to leak into the car. Carry a small shovel in your trunk as well as a milk jug with sand or kitty litter for traction. An old backpack or duffle bag works great to store water and snacks, a flashlight with fresh batteries, and a blanket. Keep a charger for your cell phone in your car. These few items will help you survive and may save your life if you get stranded. The best decision is to simply not travel during bad conditions if at all possible. Remember, if you see or suspect a crime of any type, report it immediately to (785) 806-9500. — Terry Hollingsworth, Chief of Police

\*Osage County Fire District 4 (Overbrook Fire & EMT) Winter house fires are always a concern. If you heat or supplement your heat with live-flame heating appliances such as gas heaters, wood stoves, or a fireplace be sure your flue is clear and clean and that there is adequate fresh air to prevent carbon monoxide buildup. EVERY home should have working Smoke Alarms as well as Carbon Monoxide detectors. Don't wait for a disaster before getting yours! If you have questions, contact Fire Chief, Russell Mitchell at 785-806-9501

\*Overbrook Animal Control: Pets require extra attention during cold, winter weather. A supply of fresh, unfrozen water is very important. If they stay outdoors, assure they have enough straw or bedding in their house to burrow into. It's natural for dogs to "den" during cold weather. Remember to get your tags and watch that your pets are not running loose. Report animals concerns to Officer Russell Mitchell, 785-806-9501

\*Winter Weather Street Maintenance – to allow City Maintenance to clear snow to 2-lane width, please do not park on major access streets. And, if you do your own snow plowing please do not scrape the chipseal street surface with your plow. It causes damage to the street and puts gravel into ditches and yards.

### Ordinance No. 375

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 91, SECTION 91-625, SUBSECTION (B) REGARDING THE FEES CHARGED FOR ANIMAL LICENSES IN THE CITY OF OVERBROOK, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OVERBROOK, KANSAS:

SECTION 1: PERMIT FEE: The permit fees for the permit year beginning on January 1 of each calendar year are as follows:

- 1. For each non-neutered male animal \$10
- 2. For each neutered male animal \$5
- 3. For each un-spayed female animal \$10
- 4. For each spayed female animal \$5

SECTION 2: LATE FEE: As of March 1st each year a \$5 late fee will be charged per tag, making the cost for tags purchased after February as follows:

- 1. For each non-neutered male animal \$15
- 2. For each neutered male animal \$10
- 3. For each un-spayed female animal \$15
- 4. For each spayed female animal \$10

SECTION 3: AUTO RENEWAL: For those animals who had a previous year tag and have a current rable: vaccination on file at City Hall, we will process an auto-renewal when we generate the February utility bills. We will charge the permit fee to your account and will mail the license and tag with the utility bi If you no longer have the animal or have added additional animals, you will still need to contact City Hall. This option is only available to animals with a current rables vaccination on file at the time the license is issued.

SECTION 4: IMPOUND FEES: 1/13 Impound fees are the responsibility of the animal owner. Before the animal can be claimed, owner must purchase City of Overbrook tag (when applicable), pay all outstanding fines related to the Issue that led to the animal being picked up, and provide proof of payment to be able to pick up the animal.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage approval and publication as provided by law.
