2018 Pet Tags

If you have previously registered your pets with the City of Overbrook and have current rabies vaccinations on file, you will receive your 2018 pet tag(s) along with your January City Utility Bill. A charge will be added to your bill: \$5.00 for pets that are spayed or neutered and \$10.00 for pets that are intact. Please let us know if your information has changed.

If you need to register new pets, forms are available on-line at the City of Overbrook Web Site, www.overbrookks.com, and at Overbrook City Hall. Present the fee, registration form, and proof of rabies vaccination to the clerks at Overbrook City Hall to receive your tag(s).

Goose Cannon Testing

The Overbrook Police and Maintenance Departments will be conducting a test firing of the "Goose Cannon" on Thursday, January 4th at 1:30 pm, weather permitting, at the City Lake. During the testing, the public will not be allowed to walk around the lake or fish. Please check the cities website or Facebook as well as the Police Department's Facebook for any updates.

The purpose of the cannon is not to harm the geese, but to reduce the geese population by scaring them away.
