City News

Update on Casey's General Store – the District Manager called to say that since the new business year for Casey's General Store just recently began, she believes work on the old BP Station will start soon. She also said she was giving attention to the current facility to assure business was going well with the increased traffic load. Let's hope we see work begin at the BP Station soon!

Thank you residents for contacting City Hall regarding the total number of dogs allowed at an Overbrook residence. City Council reviewed that input at their June meeting and decided to consider creating a new Ordinance regarding animal husbandry including the allowable number of dogs, the manner in which they are kept (humane treatment), and other details about animal control and enforcement. More information will be presented and discussed at the July Council meeting.

Overbrook Water – Kramer Consulting, LLC from Topeka, a firm the City has used twice in the past to evaluate our wells and water system has been contracted and is underway with a study of the current system. Upon completion they will submit a report to the City, which will be instrumental in setting priorities for upgrading our drinking water system. All this thanks to the Grant we received.

City Budget planning for 2018 is underway. The Mayor and Council work with our CPA, our Treasurer, and each department head to calculate a budget that is as conservative as possible but still provides funds for all City services. A Public Hearing of the proposed Budget is held in August each year. The date and time of this year's Hearing will be promoted as soon as it's set.

Open Positions on City Boards – a position on the Planning & Zoning Board and on the Park & Rec Board are open to City residents. If you are interested in being a candidate, contact City Hall.

OPR Youth Baseball – games continue as league play works its way toward the tournament later this summer. Also this month, there is a Flint Hills League Midget Boys Tourney here the week of July 10th. And, Ray Burt's High School age boys' team is hosting a tourney on our field July 22-23. - A **Kids Fishing Clinic** will be held the week of July 10th at the Picnic Shelter in the City Park. - The annual **Kids Fishing Derby** will be held in September. Watch for updates on this.


