**Overbrook Farmers' Market** – Our local Farmers' Market will be open on Mondays from 4pm to 7pm and will continue through September. You can find the market in downtown Overbook on Market Street just west of Maple Street. Come shop for beautiful produce, hand crafted soaps, farm fresh eggs, local honey, and lots of other wonderful goods. If you are interested in being a vendor, operational guidelines and applications are available at Overbrook City Hall.

**Overbrook Police Department** – Please remember safety and courtesy when riding/driving ATVs, UTVs, and golf carts. First off, anyone driving anyone of these vehicles MUST have a valid driver's license to be on the streets of Overbrook. All ATV drivers under the age of 18 is required to wear a D.O.T. approved helmet. Riders may cross U.S. 56 but may NOT ride on the highway, so if you are going to get gas, find a route that keeps you off the highway. Lastly, all traffic laws, both state and city must be obeyed. These include speed limits, stop signs and yield signs. Everyone's safety is our top priority when riding these vehicles. Thanks, Chief Terry Hollingsworth

**Overbrook Independence Day Celebration** - The annual City of Overbrook Independence Day Celebration will be held on Thursday, July 4, at the City Lake at Jones Park. We have two fireworks stands in town this year. Garrett's Fireworks is in their usual location at 204 W 8<sup>th</sup> St. The Overbrook Fair Board is running their fireworks stand from the Boy Scout Building at 5<sup>th</sup> and Cedar. Please check them both out! Please remember that discharge of fireworks on Streets and Public Property is Prohibited. Fireworks can be discharged beginning at 8:00 a.m. on June 27<sup>th</sup>. The daily times are as follows: Thursday, June 27<sup>th</sup> 8AM-10:30PM; Friday, June 28<sup>th</sup> 8AM-midnight; Saturday, June 29<sup>th</sup> 8AM-midnight; Sunday, June 30<sup>th</sup> 8AM-10:30PM; Monday, July 1st 8AM-10:30PM; Tuesday, July 2nd 8AM-10:30PM; Wednesday, July 3rd 8AM-10:30PM; Thursday, July 4<sup>th</sup> 8AM-midnight; and Friday, July 5<sup>th</sup>, 8AM-midnight. 4<sup>th</sup> of July Celebration – Overbrook is celebrating Independence Day with a bang! It all starts at 10:30 am with the Children's Bike Parade. Children may decorate their bikes and meet at the Old Middle School. Free hot dogs and drinks will be served to the kids. Please bring a plate of treats to share. Then from 1-5 pm kids and adults swim free at the Overbrook City Pool. Finally come to the City Lake for food, fun, and fireworks from 6-10 pm. There will be food, drinks, music, and more! Fireworks will begin approximately at 10pm. In the event of rain, the celebration will be held Friday, July 5. Thank you to Overbrook PRIDE for sponsoring this event, to our Fire Department for keeping us safe as we celebrate, and to the many local groups that make the event possible, including the Overbrook Historical Society and Museum Committee.
