Change to DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME – Sunday, March 12 – Remember two things . . . adjust your clocks **AHEAD ONE HOUR** and put **NEW BATTERIES** in your smoke detectors!

- **Note:** If you do not also have a Carbon Monoxide detector in your home – take time to purchase one and plug it in. It may save your life and the lives of those you care about – including your pets!

FIRE WARNING! – until we get sufficient rain/moisture to allow for safe burning **PLEASE** be extremely careful if you burn leaves. Until then, some days we may be under a County-wide Burn Ban. That information is posted on City of Overbrook Facebook Page and at City Hall. Always check with City Hall before you burn! Leaves and branches can be burned – **DO NOT BURN TRASH OR PROCESSED LUMBER!** ALWAYS have tools ready at your burn site to assure you can control your fire and put it out – **COMPLETELY** if needed.

Overbrook Police Department in conjunction with Safe Street Coalition is promoting the “Lock it, Remove it, or Lose it!” campaign. Always remove your keys and personal valuables such as purse, wallet, cell phone, or any other electronic device **EVERYTIME** you get out of your vehicle – then, **LOCK YOUR CAR**. Signs and flyers will soon be posted around town referencing this campaign. Crime occurs when opportunity exists. Don’t be a victim! **REMEMBER:** If you see something; **SAY** something! Always call 9-1-1 for the quickest response! Your help has kept our crime rate low.

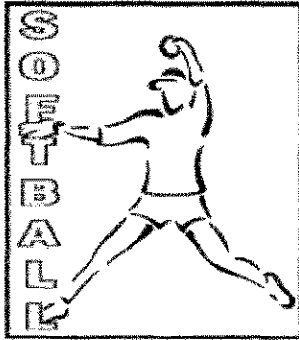
