Pets found at large without a tag may be impounded and owners may be fined.

#### CITYWIDE CLEANUP DAY ON SATURDAY, APRIL 16TH



This is a great opportunity to clean up unused items around your home, both indoors and outdoors. Please be aware that we cannot take used tires, refrigerators, air conditioners, oil, or any items considered to be hazardous waste!

Three Dumpsters will be available for residents to drop off items at the ball field parking lot from 8AM until 1PM. During this time, staff will help unload and verify that we can accept the items. If unable to drop off before 1PM, please contact Chief Hollingsworth to make other arrangements. Please, no drop offs after 4PM.

**PAINT:** This year we will handle paint differently. Look for the designated area for dropping off paint. We can take latex paint at no charge. There will be a charge to dispose of any other type of paint. If there is no label on the paint, it will be considered Non-Latex. The charge is as follows:

Any spray paint can \$2.00 each
Any non-latex can of paint \$5.00 each

**DOCUMENT SHREDDING:** We will have four locked shred bins available from UVSInc for secure shredding of paper. If you have documents you want to shred, this is a free opportunity to have that done. When the 4 bins are full, we will not be able to accept any more shred items.

LIMB PICK-UP: The Overbrook Rotary Club and PRIDE volunteers will pick up limbs that are left curbside throughout the city of Overbrook from 9am to noon. Limbs must be cut to a manageable size and stacked at the curb. Volunteers are welcome to participate; meet-up is scheduled for 8am @ KSB. The tree dump will be open for any residents that want to haul their own limbs or yard waste.

**IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO HELP:** We invite civic groups, youth groups or anyone else to volunteer to pick items up from those citizens that are not able to bring their items to the drop-off points.

#### **Prescription Take Back**

Citywide Cleanup Day
Location: Baseball field parking lot

The City of Overbrook, along with the Overbrook Police Department will be holding a prescription take back day during the citywide cleanup day. Medications for disposal can be dropped off at the baseball field parking lot from 8AM until 1PM. This service is free and anonymous.

This event provides the public the opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous, expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. The city will also accept tablets, capsules, patches, and other solid forms of prescription drugs. Liquids, syringes, and other sharps, and illegal drugs will not be accepted.

The Overbrook Police Department and City Hall will take back prescriptions year round during normal business hours.
