Overbrook Historical Society - The story of the Overbrook Historical Society and Museum (OHSM) is a relatively short (and young) one. Joyce Dillon along with Patty Colson, Loretta Warren, Donna Sowers, Barbara Woodruff and Wade Sisson began discussions of a place where the stories of Overbrook families and the community could be stored and accessed by the public in 2017. The group explored several places such as the old high school gym, the former doctor's office building on main street and the second floor of the city offices. They eventually found a home when the City of Overbrook offered them the corner of main street across from the library and next to the post office in 2020.

The Articles of Corporation, Mission Statement and Bylaws were created followed by receipt of the Employer Identification Number and Tax Exemption 501 (c)(3) status when the pandemic hit. The wheels screeched to a halt and slowly started to roll again in 2021.

The Overbrook Historical Society and Museum recently held its Annual Meeting. Newly elected officers are President, Pam O'Bryhim; Vice-President, Donna Sowers; Secretary, Wade Sisson; Treasurer, Bob Greenfield; Historian, Loretta Warren. The Board of Directors also includes Past-President, Joyce Dillon; Patty Colson and Dean Supple. Except for Barbara Woodruff, the original core group continues to seek fruition to their early visions.

OHSM's Mission Statement states that the Overbrook Historical Society and Museum shall collect, preserve, and document the history of our town, Overbrook, Kansas, and its people. We will find, build, maintain and operate a museum to showcase Overbrook's history and heritage.

The Organization will complete the design phase of the museum and be ready for the bidding process by year end. Fund raising and grant applications are ongoing with a major Capital Campaign kickoff planned for early 2023.
