The police department now has jump boxes and lockout kits so they are equipped to help you if you lock your keys in your car or your battery is dead. You can call 785-215-4627 or 785-806-9501 for assistance. Halloween will be here soon, remember to dress your child in a costume that can be seen while walking, carry a flashlight or have lights or reflective tape on their costumes. Drivers slow down and be alert, turn your headlights on earlier in the evening so children will be seen. 

Water Project Updates – The water pressure might be low in some areas due to the switching of lines from the old lines to the new lines. Carstensen has given the city a preliminary schedule of when they will be removing the old water pits and re-seeding lawns. You can view the proposed schedule at www.overbrookks.com/water-distrubution project. They have asked for an extension and the city council is reviewing the requirements. Central Tank will have the west water tower completed in 4 about weeks.

Tips on Reducing your water bill – Tip #2 Look for leaks and repair them right away. Most leaks are easy to detect and repair. For sinks, check faucets and pipes for dripping water. Replace washers, and repair or replace fixtures, if needed. For toilets, add food coloring to the tank water and check the bowl in 15 minutes. (Don't flush) If there's color in the toilet bowl, it means there's a leak. Tip # 3 coming next month.
