Reminder of City Firework Ordinance -Fireworks may be legally discharged within the city limits of Overbrook from July 1st through July 5th, between the hours of 10:30 a.m. and 10:30 p.m. each day. However, on July 4th, fireworks may be discharged from 10:30 a.m. until 12:00 midnight to allow for extended celebration of Independence Day. Outside of these dates and times, it is unlawful to discharge, fire off, or explode any fireworks—including squibs, rockets, firecrackers, Roman candles, or any other combustible fireworks—within the city limits. If someone wishes to discharge fireworks outside of the July 1–5 window, they must submit a request to the Overbrook City Council in advance. The request must be approved prior to the event.
